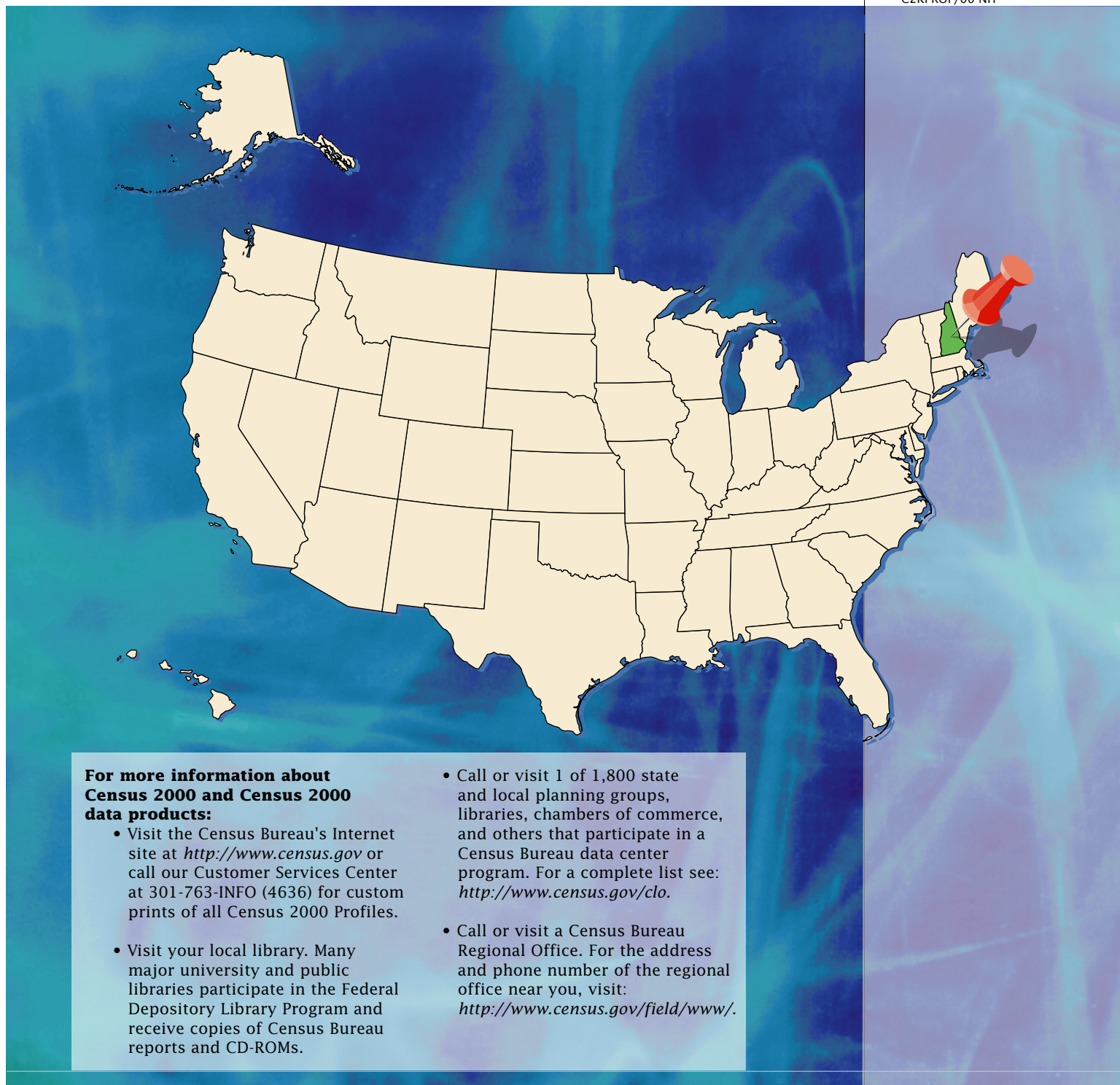

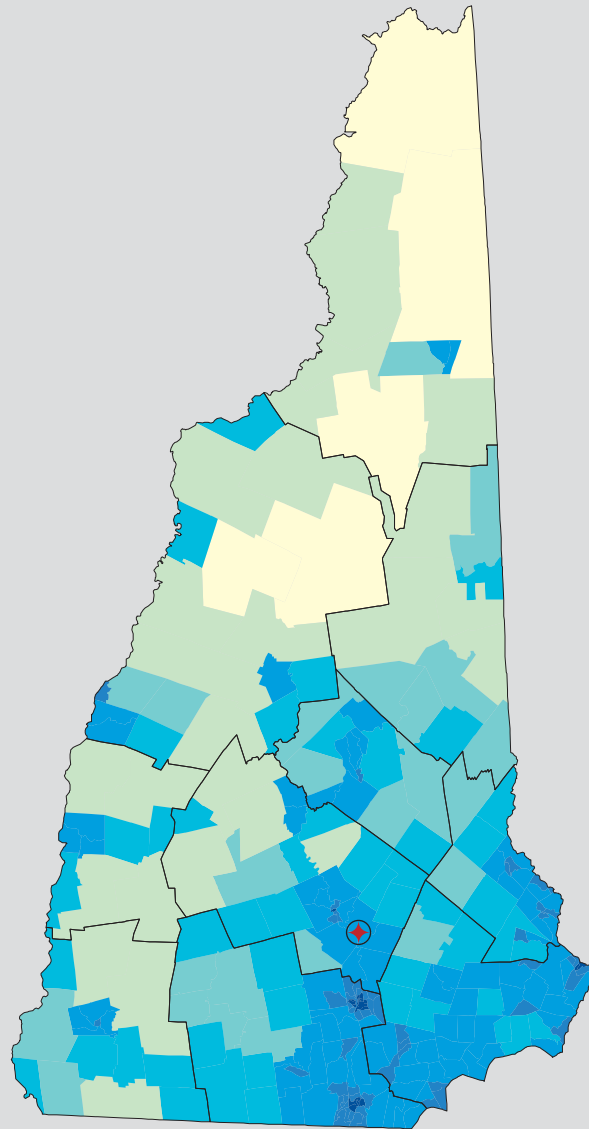

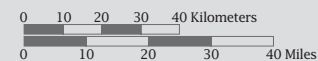
Census 2000: New Hampshire Profile

Population Density by Census Tract

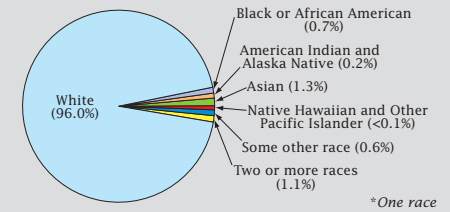


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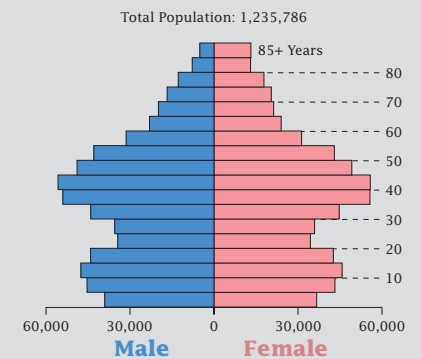


State Race* Breakdown

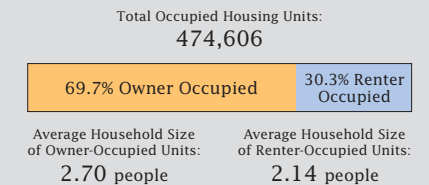


Hispanic or Latino (of any race)
